COMMON VIOLATIONS

Our Inspectors commonly see in operations is lack of date marking foods. Our code states refrigerated, ready-to-eat, time/temperature controlled for safety food prepared and held for more than 24 hours is to be marked to indicate the date the food is to be consumed on the premises, sold, or discarded when held at a temperature of 41° F or less for a maximum of seven days. The day of preparation is counted as day one.



As some may know, we have been transitioning over to new staff. We welcome our new Director STAFF of Environmental Health, Nina Johannsen, who took over in February after Martha Bowen retired.
