Health Behaviors: Adult Tobacco Use

Did you know 60% of Sandusky County adult tobacco users have attempted to quit smoking in the last year?

If you are interested in quitting tobacco/nicotine use, there is **free** help available. The Ohio Tobacco Quit Line (OTQL) is a free, nicotine quit program that can be done online or by tele-counseling. The OTQL is usually 5-7 sessions in length and provides two weeks of free nicotine replacement therapy for each session completed. **You can enroll by calling 1-800-QUIT-NOW or online at https://ohio.quitlogix.org**.

Sandusky County Public Health Funding in Action

New-All Inclusive Play Park at Rodger Young

Sandusky County Public Health's Creating Healthy Communities (CHC) Program partnered with the Kiwanis Club of Fremont, the Sandusky County Board of Developmental Disabilities, City of Fremont and other key community stakeholders to build a new all inclusive play park at one of the most widely used parks in the city of Fremont. Through the CHC grant \$25,000 was donated to help create the 10,100 square foot space designed with safety surfacing to allow people of all abilities to a have access to various inclusive structures and the opportunity to move throughout the play space safely and independently. Now, children of all abilities are able to engage and play together and build relationships.



Naloxbox Project Year 2

SCPH is enhancing our efforts with Opiate Prevention and Response by placing Naloxboxes in public places. SCPH has partnered with the Mental Health and Recovery Services Board of Seneca, Ottawa, Sandusky, and Wyandot Counties for project funding. During Phase 1 (2021) of the program, we placed five Naloxboxes located at Community Fortress, Beacon Behavioral Health Services, NAMI, and two boxes at Fremont Municipal Court. During Phase 2 we are going to continue our efforts by adding Naloxboxes to local hotels, gas stations and other interested community partner's sites. The purpose of this program is to give the community access to Narcan when situations arise. Narcan is a no-harm drug meaning there are no negative effects of this drug. You do not have to be addicted to opioids to overdose, accidents can happen. If you

- Increase opportunities for physical activity where Ohioans live, work, and play










SCPH is a recipient of the Put a Lid On It Bike Helmet Safety Awareness Grant Program for 2022. This event is located in Downtown Fremont and is from 10-2. These bike helmets are free to the public and come in a range of sizes to help make sure you or your child have a properly fitting helmet for riding. If the event is canceled due to weather, it will be rescheduled for May 14th.

Mouth: Can you fit 1 finger between your chin and the strap? Open your mouth; can you feel it pull down your helmet?
